It shall be the privilege and responsibility of the City of Gainesville, Texas to welcome our Nation's Medal of Honor Recipients at every opportunity.

In so doing we pay homage to the principles which the Medal of Honor represents... **Duty, Honor, Country.**

The Medal of Honor is the highest award for valor in action against an enemy force which can be bestowed upon an individual serving in the Armed Services of the United States. This honor is generally presented to the recipient by the President of the United States of America in the name of Congress. Gainesville, Texas is the only city in America to host our nation's highest decorated hero's annually to promote patriotism and celebrate the heroism of the recipients.

Our program began 17 years ago with a couple of Medal of Honor Recipients who drove to town to visit students in our community and enjoy some local fare. Since then we have grown to 4 full days of patriotic celebration. We begin with a grand welcome at DFW airport with the recipients and their families escorted by a motorcade 60 miles back to Gainesville. Patriots from all generations stand along the route holding banners, homemade signs, flags and cheer as the motorcade passes. It is genuinely a moving experience for anyone who has ever witnessed this event. The following days there are visits to local schools, a Patriot Dinner, a Banquet and a full military parade on Saturday concluding with a book signing event at the Gainesville Civic Center. Every bit of this program is organic and that's what makes it so special. The sincerity of our volunteers and those who support this program in a multitude of ways makes it unique and full of the American spirit.



THE MEDAL OF HONOR EVENT IN GAINESVILLE, TX.

Wednesday, April 10, 2019 was the arrival of the Medal of Honor recipients with a motorcade procession down I-35 beginning in Dallas/Fort Worth, TX to Gainesville, TX which is the Host City for the MOH program event that is held here every year since it's inception in 2001, this being it's 18th year for this event. Gainesville is the nation's only MOH Host City and the town is very proud and honored of this event. This year, 24 recipients will be honored.

Tommy Moore, MOH Host City Program Board President, said "This program is unique because it doesn't just focus on "however long the duration of their action lasted" but also the family and the life that these heroes came home and lived after their service".

Gainesville is proud and honored to be the host City and that pride and honor is instilled in the families and children. "You can't buy honor and integrity, but it can be taught", a quote from Arlene Loyd, Gainesville Economic Development Corp. Executive Director.

On Wednesday, most of our group car-pooled to a spot along I-35 to watch the progression of MOH recipients and over 500+ motorcycles pass by as we and hundreds of others waved and saluted as they passed by to their destination just north of Gainesville. It was a moving and a humbling parade to watch pass by. We were all looking forward to the parade on Saturday but with a forecast of 100% rain, the MOH Board decided it was best to cancel the parade. Hopefully another year we can try this again!

We all wished him well as the men followed the disabled Vet to his pickup. After hearing who this man was, the store clerk lamented not taking a picture. As the Veteran drove away, the men each returned sporting an engraved (personal) Medal of Honor medallion stating the Veteran's name and date of his heroic deed serving in the Vietnam War. The casino opened as the WinStar Casinos in 2004, and was expanded (with a 395-room hotel tower) and renamed WinStar World Casino in 2009; it's 600,000 square feet of casino floor made it the world's largest casino at the time. In 1991 the Chickasaw Nation opened a small bingo hall in this spot and it's progressed ever since with electronic gaming, 27-hole golf club, to the hotel and the RV park to the present 66,950 square foot convention center.

FMCA'S 99TH ANNUAL INTERNATIONAL CONVENTION & EXPO RALLY

FMCA hosted it's 99th annual International Convention and RV Expo in Perry, GA from March 13th through the 16th. The official RV count on the Georgia National Fairgrounds totaled 2,542 units, which was comprised of 352 display RV's and 2,190 member and guest RV's. More than 5,000 people attended, including a record 1,700 who were attending an FMCA convention for the first time.

"Peachy in Perry" served as the theme for this gathering which featured hundreds of educational seminars, interactive displays, a complete 3-day RV Basics Bootcamp, and dozens of entertainment acts.

The expo also served as host to more than 300 commercial vendors offering RV related products and services. People could buy everything from electric folding bikes and gold carts, to generators and jewelry.

Entertainment this year was impressive, filling the Reaves Arena with headliner acts such as Louis Prima Jr. & the Witnesses, as well as Cornell Gunter's Coasters, The Platters and The Drifters. Nearly a dozen other entertainment acts were featured over the 4 day run of the convention.

FMCA currently has more than 77,000 members and serves to educate and enhance the RVer lifestyle. The 100th annual convention will be held in Minot, ND, August 14-17, and will feature a presentation by Captain "Sully" Sullenberger, the pilot who flew the plane that became known as the "Miracle on the Hudson".







The Chapter Fair was held on March 13th with great success! Had 22 folks sign in that were interested in our club. All the Chapters put on a great display and we had a good crowd there as the First Timers had their meeting also that day right before the Fair began.



With so many vendors at the rally, there were two buildings to go through to see it all. There were even a few outside set up in tents ! And always plenty of food vendors so no one went hungry !!
